## Wandering Heart: "Songs of Loudest Praise"

This Lent, we are focusing on the life and faith of one of Jesus' most famous disciples. In Peter, we see a person who is both steadfast and unsteady, a dear friend and a betrayer, a follower and a wanderer. In Peter, we often see ourselves - a very normal human trying to figure it all out—just like us.

As Holy Week begins, Peter is no longer front and center, and so we imagine he is with the rest of the disciples when Jesus enters Jerusalem on a colt. As they witness crowds shouting hosannas, the disciples are confused. People are supposed to be praising Caesar, but instead they are shouting for the one entering the city on a donkey. Their singing is subversive, courageous, and contagious. Their praise shows the ripple effect of public displays of faith.

## \*Confession and Forgiveness

P The Gospel of John tells us that crowds gathered to praise Jesus as he entered Jerusalem, singing

and shouting with confidence.

After describing the crowd, however, the Gospel writer zooms in on the disciples and tells us that

while the crowds shouted praise at Jesus, the disciples were confused.

The text says, "the disciples did not understand what was happening" (John 12:16).

A lot of our lives may look like this: either we understand God's presence in our lives and want to shout it from the rooftop—or we're standing on the side of the parade missing our chance to sing.

That is why we need the prayer of confession.

Because life happens fast, and without a doubt, we have stood where the disciples stood. So let us pray, for we don't want to miss our chance to sing:

C Holy God, we want to run into the streets and sing your praise! We want to be bold and unashamed of this good-news Gospel. However, too often we find ourselves standing against the wall. Too often we stay quiet.

Too often we let others carry the song.

Forgive us for the moments when we could lead the parade but instead find ourselves standing on the sidelines.

Show us which songs are ours to sing.

Show us which parades are ours to lead,

and then give us the courage and conviction to do both.

With hope and honesty we pray, amen.

P Friends, no matter where you are on the parade route—whether you are waving palm branches through the streets or standing against the wall, quiet and cautious—Jesus marched for you.

Jesus' love, his striving for justice and mercy, it was for you.

You are included in this story and nothing can ever change that.

So hear these words and trust them deep in your bones:

We have reason to sing, for Jesus Christ loved you yesterday.

Jesus Christ loves you today.

And Jesus Christ will love you tomorrow.

You are forgiven, claimed, and sent to serve.

Go out and sing.

Go out trusting these words.

## WALK A WAY— Walking Pilgrimage—La Crosse, WI to Winona, MN—May 8-10, 2024

Find refuge and step away from your routine on a pilgrimage experience along the Mississippi River. Explore a way of being that supports listening and letting go. We depart from Mason City on Wednesday morning, May 8, and return late afternoon on Friday, May 10. We will walk approximately 28 miles from La Crosse, WI, to Winona, MN, over three days on the Great River State Trail and Flyway Trail. Overnight accommodations include the Franciscan Spirituality Center (FSC) in La Crosse, WI, and the Alverna Center in Winona, MN. Private spiritual direction is available for an additional fee at the FSC. The Reverend Stephen Benitz of St. John's Episcopal Church and Becky Elsbernd, Parish Nurse of Trinity Lutheran Church, will guide us on our pilgrimage. A support vehicle travels with us to assist as needed and to provide snacks and water along the way. Cost: \$300 (this includes transportation, overnight accommodations, and meals.) Partial scholarships are available. Participants will be responsible for paying for their own celebratory lunch on Friday. Register and pay a \$150 deposit to save your spot. Space is limited to nine people. *The registration deadline is March 31, 2024.*
