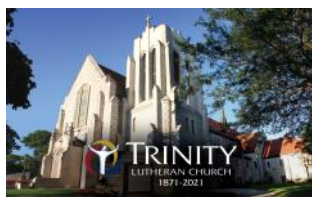

Upon this piece of paper was a promise from God spoken 34 years ago: "Daniel Wayne Hanson, child of God, you have been sealed by the Holy Spirit and marked with the cross of Christ forever." I keep this bulletin framed on my desk. I keep it next to a picture from my baptism. I admit, sometimes I

This promise is also for you in the sacred waters of baptism. Whether it be with the splash of water on your face in the morning, making the sign of the cross on your forehead, or with an old photo, may you always remember this promise in baptism that holds us steadfast in God's grace.

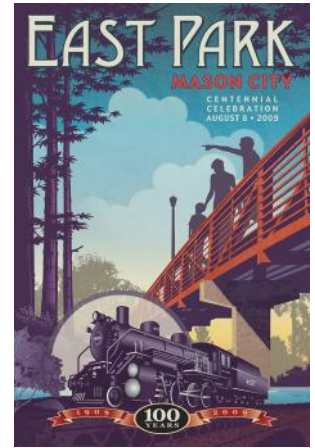

GAYE SCOTT

Matthew 28:20b "And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age." NRSV (Jesus' words to His disciples after His resurrection)

I've had several health concerns over the years, but one minor surgery I faced in 2015 was to place a catheter in my stomach in preparation for peritoneal dialysis. I was so nervous! I knew that when I woke up there would be a hole in my stomach with a tube protruding. I just couldn't seem to settle down. Finally, just before I went

under the anesthesia, I FELT the words, 'I AM WITH YOU.' I knew that was God's promise to me, and I calmed right down.

For the first 20 years of our marriage, my husband and I exchanged greeting cards on the 9th day of every month. I recently noticed a very small stand-up display that Dick had given me for our 230th month anniversary in 1996. The front shows trees, a mountain, and a star, with the words, "Don't fear tomorrow, God is already there." On the back Dick had written, "God's presence is forever present!" Those words give me great comfort. I learned years ago that God's presence is not dependent on our perception of it. When Dick was in the nursing home with Alzheimer's, he told me, "You know, I don't think God has ever left me." He had great faith.

My mother's last birthday gift to me, selected by my sister, was a necklace. It is heart-shaped, with a small angel inside and these words, "I am with you always." Is it any wonder I have chosen these words from Matthew as my favorite Bible verse? Lately, my health has worsened, with my kidney transplant functioning about 15% along with the very strong probability of developing pancreatic cancer and coronary artery disease. I have refused very radical pancreas surgery because it could worsen my kidney function. There will not be another transplant, and I will not go back on dialysis. But I have great peace, in spite of fluid build-up in my feet and legs, and uncomfortable digestive issues. The reason for that is that I know God is with me, and He will take care of me one way or the other. That brings joy.

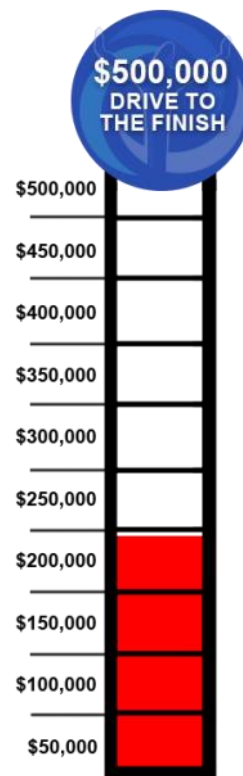
Question: Do YOU know God is with you?? How can you be sure? (see also Isaiah 41:10 and Joshua 1:9)

Prayer: Dear Lord, I have so much to thank you for, but most importantly I thank you for your presence with me as I face my life journey. You promised, and it is so! Bless all those who know you and those who seek you, that they may feel this same peace. Guide me to know and do your will, until I see you face to face. I love you! In Jesus' name, Alleluia, Amen!

A TALE OF TWO BISHOPS: BISHOP EMERITUS MICHAEL LAST

Trinity is fortunate to not only have the current Bishop as “one of our own,” but we are doubly blessed to have Bishop Emeritus Michael Last in our midst. Last shared a bit about his time as Bishop and how he came to be in this position in the first place.

Similar to many children in the Lutheran church, Last grew up in a large well-established Lutheran parish in Ottumwa, IA. He can’t remember a time when his family wasn’t active in church, and as he grew up, he became more involved in everything at church from children’s choir, Confirmation, Sunday school, youth group and church camp.

Perhaps a little different in the Last home was the fact that one of the pastors came to their home to bring Communion to Last’s mother who had developed multiple sclerosis in her middle-age years and was no longer able to attend services at church. Last witnessed “pastoral care” and “the Spirit began to sow seeds of my love for my ministry and great respect for the office of pastor.”

Perhaps because of this close contact with his pastors, he was invited to preach a Sunday sermon and on occasion, he also helped distribute Communion to the congregation. Last gave personal witness to his faith at retreats and campfires among his own age group, thus adding to his early experience with speaking publicly. “Less than nervous, I found myself relishing talk about my faith and the presence of God in my life,” he shared.

Another important person in his faith journey during Last’s high school years, his history teacher, a former Catholic

priest, sensed his spiritual side and invited Last on weekend prayer retreats at New Mel-laray Monastery. Last said, “I loved them, and as time passed, I made many such visits over the years. It was ‘a place away’ wherein I often found solace... especially in years later, as an ordained pastor, when the challenges of ministry could be demanding and at times bordering on overwhelming.”

This need for solace continued when Last was elected “time and again” to serve many years in the role of Bishop of the Western Iowa Synod. This was at a time when there was “considerable unrest” in the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, and in particular, the synod where he had been elected to serve as bishop. This “unrest” consisted of several “hot button issues in the ELCA,” one of which was the strong opinion about human sexuality, a topic that caused some synods to dissolve.

Last explained: “So difficult were the issues being debated nationally, my safety as bishop and moderator among my synod was on occasion fraught with physical threats. On more than one occasion, church ushers at congregational meetings had to intervene for my safety after heated meetings discussing issues stirring back then in the ELCA. As synod bishop, I would be escorted to my car after the end of the meetings. I insisted we treat each other with respect and treat each other as brothers and sisters in Christ during these times of raucous public discourse.”

He continued: “After my leadership during rocky times in the Western Synod, upon my retirement I was awarded the title, Bishop Emeritus, a recognition that we had been able to turn the synod away from conflict and redirect their international outreach (particularly in Tanzania).”

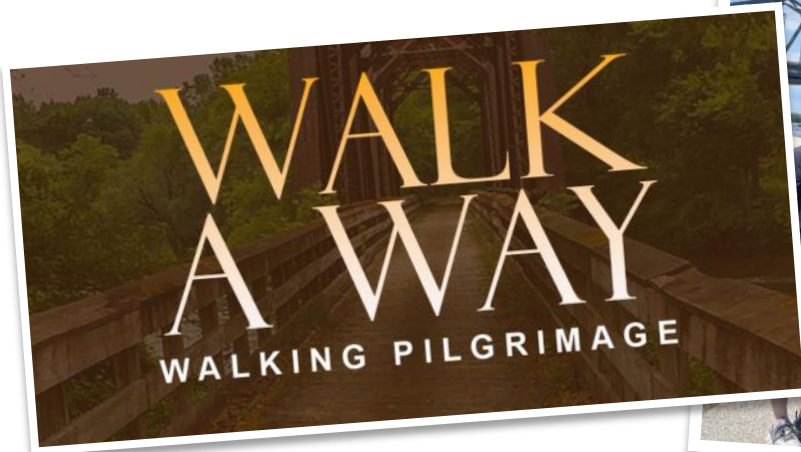
Last reminisced, “I’m so glad God empowered me to stay the course and complete multiple terms in office! Despite the excruciatingly long hours and the late winter nights traveling to synod congregations (with snow often chasing me home in the dark of night), I loved wearing the mantle of Bishop with the sure support of nearly all my staff cheering me on, and my dear wife Colleen looking after my well-being late and well into the evenings.”

Along with the occasional “ribald debates” and stress of the position, Last said that through it all, he “felt the close presence of God watching over me, nudging me to stay the course and affirming I was a needed steward of God’s work, speaking the truth in love.”

WALK A WAY 2024: LACROSSE, WI TO WINONA, MN

Ten people from Trinity and St. John's Episcopal Church recently completed a 30-mile walk along the Great River State Trail/Flyway Trail from La Crosse, WI to Winona, MN. This walking pilgrimage, the 2nd "Walk A Way," was a chance to experience nature while learning to be still and listen to God. Unique accommodations added to the special atmosphere of this trip. The first night was spent at the Franciscan Spirituality Center in La Crosse and the second night at the Alverna Center on St. Mary's University campus in Winona.

Besides the leaders, Becky Elsbernd from Trinity and Father Stephen Benitz from St. John's, seven other walkers were: Sam Hunt, Kay Larson, Jane Carlson, Garrett True, Joann Johnson, Jane Reynolds and Karen Jacobs. Michelle Murray served as the "sag driver."

Elsbernd, co-leader of the Walk A Way and 2nd time participant, shared: "The Walk A Way Pilgrimage is a unique opportunity to be surrounded by nature with intentional time to connect with oneself, each other and God. It's amazing to see the Spirit move in and among us as we journey together."

Jacobs, a 1st time participant, added: "The Pilgrimage was so much more than a walk. It was seeing God in friendships, seeing God in nature, and seeing God in yourself."

Kay Larson, another 1st timer, mentioned, "There's no better way of feeling closer to God than receiving 'nature therapy' in his beautiful creation! It was fun getting to know fellow pilgrims, too. It was definitely a time to get away and focus on the present. Fabulous experience!"

Reynolds, a 2nd time participant, shared that she was "more prepared physically this time but also spiritually and mentally." Reynolds said the time for solitary walking was the Pilgrimage's greatest gift to her. "I was able to breathe, focus, and be present in the moment—something difficult for me. The practice of being present and silent are skills I can build on."

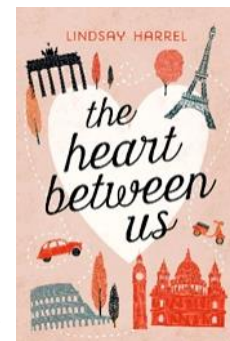
