

BETTER TOGETHER - A LETTER FROM PASTOR DAN GERRIETTS

n 2018, movie star Chris Pratt (*Guardians of the Galaxy, Jurassic World, Parks and Rec*) received the Generation Award at the MTV Movie & TV Awards. Pratt, in his acceptance speech, spoke to the mostly younger audience (he was 38 at the time) as an elder with wisdom to impart. He was both silly and deeply profound. Clips of the speech quickly went viral.

Rule number one was: "Breathe. If you don't, you'll suffocate." Pratt went on to talk about prayer, the reality of God's love, and how to give medicine to a dog. But it was his advice about community and how we treat one another that garnered the most attention: "Don't be a [jerk]. If you're strong, be a protector. If you're smart, be a humble

influencer. Strength and intelligence can be weapons. Don't wield them against the weak. That makes you a bully. Be bigger than that."

In a Gen Z kind of way, Pratt expressed what has been a core tenet of the Christians faith for centuries – that we are made for community. Our particular gifts should be used for the good of our neighbors. And we are better together than we are as individuals. God made us this way.

This month at Trinity, we are celebrating two new members to our faith community – Pastor Beverly Butler and Dani Vogel. Pastor Butler joins our staff as our new pastoral lead for care, bereavement and visitation ministries. Dani comes as our new Youth Director with particular focus on high school ministry and support of middle school and elementary programming. Both Beverly and Dani bring great gifts for building community. We are thrilled to have them.

As we welcome these new staff, we also need to recognize the gifts of our current staff and members who have bolstered our community and helped us care for one another. I am especially grateful for Becky Elsbernd, who expanded her hours last fall to help support our Care Ministries – and Pastor Daniel Hanson, who has shepherded our High School Youth as they get ready for the ELCA Youth Gathering. Scores of lay leaders have also stepped up, proving we are most certainly better together than we are as individuals.

Finally, we want to celebrate our community that is the Northeastern Iowa Synod. Ten staff and lay people attended the C3 Event in Waverly a few weeks ago. This gathering of synod church leaders reminded all of us of the power of Christian community. (You can check out their reflections on page 3.)

MEET PASTOR BEVERLY BUTLER

eginning July 1, Trinity will officially have a new Pastor of Spiritual Care!

Pastor Beverly Butler will be working 15 hours each week at Trinity to provide bereavement support (including funerals) and working with Parish Nurse, Becky Elsbernd, with the care team.

Pastor Beverly has a unique background as she grew up in Panama City, Panama. Both parents were United Methodist missionaries, so she is very much in the family business! The youngest of three (she also has a brother and sister), she said her mom grew up on a farm here in North Iowa... the same farm Pastor Beverly now calls home! As a young girl, Pastor Beverly remembers visiting her grandma's farm and dreaming of raising sheep as her grandma did. In 2011 she began fulfilling that dream, and soon found out that she was not really "raising" her sheep—they had become her family. The sheep that remain are all 13 years old. A 19-year -old llama is also in the mix, and Rosa "very much guards the sheep!"

To listen to Pastor Beverly talk about her animals, her story about growing up and living in different places, and her desire to be in this role at Trinity, a sense of "the right person at the right time" came to my mind. She is an extremely easy person to talk to, and although I wanted to find out more about HER, at times she had such a caring way of turning the conversation around...so much so that I can honestly say she is one of the best listeners around.

For a quick glimpse at her life story, she graduated from Balboa High School, in what was then the Canal Zone, went to college in Alabama (her dad's home state), and after college helped her parents in their churches in southeastern lowa where they had moved in 1982. She then felt God's call to ministry and attended the Candler School of Theology at Emory University in Atlanta, GA. Pastor Beverly is an ordained United Methodist pastor and has served churches in lowa, Upstate New York, and Northeast Pennsylvania, as

well as serving as a chaplain for independent living apts. and skilled nursing facility in Norwich, NY, and also for Pathfinder Village, a residential community for children and adults with Down Syndrome in Edmeston, NY.

Pastor Beverly's most current experience includes a "Preaching Only" pastor at the United Methodist churches in Plymouth, Rock Falls, Nora Springs, and Rudd, while also serving at MercyOne North Iowa Medical Center as part-time Chaplain. She will keep her Chaplain post at the hospital while also serving in her new role at Trinity. Of course, she's not a brand new face at Trinity as she's been involved here since 2016 in Healing Touch Spiritual Ministry, and has also participated in the Monday morning activities (Centering Prayer and Lectio Divina) at Trinity for a number of years. She "loves the way Trinity is so welcoming of people coming to activities." She added, "It felt so good that the activities are available for everyone!" One thing she loves about Trinity is that "it's a community!" Pastor Beverly looks forward to "meeting people and supporting them in their spiritual journey...their LIFE journey!" She loves to visit with people and get to know them. She stressed, "I'm not new to Trinity-I'm new to being on staff!" Welcome, Pastor Beverly! We are glad to have you here!†

TRINITY QUILTERS VISIT GLOBAL HEALTH MINISTRIES

ixteen women took a trip to Fridley, MN to visit the Global Health Ministries offices and warehouse. This is a Lutheran-owned mission that ships medical supplies, newborn kits, rolled bandages, hospice kits and financial support to those in need. On an annual basis, Global Health Ministries (GHM) provides support by filling 13 shipping containers filled with over \$4 million of medical supplies and equipment, assisting 500,000 people with community-based initiatives, 1000 Community Health Workers, 1100 trained leaders, and over a million people with access to healthcare. This was a working stop for the Trinity group as all were involved in putting together "newborn kits" which consisted

This package was then tied with cord and put into a shipping box that holds seven of these packages. The Trinity group filled 23 shipping boxes while they were there. Their adventure included a wonderful meal at Sunlight Restaurant before they were off to the LWR (Lutheran World

Because 80% of the Global Missions donations come from individuals and congregations such as Trinity Lutheran Church, the Trinity Quilters are always appreciative of donations that assist them in

their mission as

there are shipping expenses, sewing machine repair costs and other expenses. Clean white sheets (cotton or cotton blend) are always in need as they are used to make bandages. Baby care kits are in need of monetary donations, dark hand towels, Ivory soap, baby socks (6-24 month size), and at least one yard of flannel fabric.

The quilters have added bandage making to their Monday gatherings and invite interested people to come and help them! The group says, "It's an easy, worthwhile project that allows us to socialize as we do it!" Last year Trinity donated 29 personal care kits, 7 blankets, 54 baby care kits, 48 school kits, and 142 quilts.

have been in the Altar Guild for ten years or more with two members (Marlene Freudenberg and Audrey Warner) having the most longevity. These two women also serve Communion at Good Shepherd once a month. Men and women are welcome to join Altar Guild. In fact. Tom Dettmer is the one male in the group currently and just might appreciate a little company.

Guild. They were wonderful women!" was one response to why a member joined. "I wanted to be a part of something with the church." "It's all behind the scenes and I wanted to join when I retired." "I love it!" "What could be more important than preparing the altar for Communion?" These answers are testament to the devotion shared by the Altar Guild members.

Some of the responsibilities have changed over the years, but the main duties consist of the following: dust the altars in the sanctuary and chapel, order and pay for baptism towels, change linens, prepare Communion (including buying the grape juice and making the Communion bread), prepare Home Communion kits, and take care of the acolyte robes, washing and mending as needed. In the past, the Communion glasses were made of glass and the Altar Guild had to wash them by hand. "It's changed throughout the years. We're getting older. It's gotten a little easier," one Guild member said.

Another area that falls under the Altar Guild's realm of responsibility is putting on the luncheon for the Kings and Queens (or band royalty) for Band Fest each year. They prepare the luncheon, make salads and cookies and come the day before to make sure everything is ready for royalty the day of Band Fest. Trinity has been hosting Band Fest royalty for over 25 years, even holding the interviews here. As President of the Altar Guild for 15 years, Julie Sanchez has everything under control and loves to serve in this capacity. Her fellow Guild members praised her for the work she is doing. "Julie is a super organizer and leader. Anything you need...Julie helps!" exclaimed one member. Sanchez shared the reason Altar Guild has meant so much to her. Like many other women, she watched her own mother participate in the Altar Guild and thought she would like to follow in her footsteps someday. It so happened that her mother died when Sanchez was nine years old. The Altar Guild always celebrated around Christmas with a big meal at the Holiday Inn, where the members dressed up and invited the pastors to join them for the meal. For two or three years after her mom died, Sanchez said she and her sister were invited to this special dinner. This is just one example of how Altar Guild members took care of each other like family...and they still do.

Another Guild member shared her "why" she was a part of Altar Guild. She shared that she joined after her husband died. "They pretty much helped me through all that!" she said. And then to lighten the mood, Marilyn Strandberg, one of the newest members, said that when she and her husband moved back to Mason City and Trinity, she "flunked bells and crochet...so quilting was out. And no one would want to taste my cooking...but I can talk!" She joined Altar Guild and found it to be a great way to serve the church. The Altar Guild is always looking for more hands. "It's easy!" one member exclaimed. "Nobody ever does it alone. Two or three people work together!" Another member chimed in, "We know WHY we do it...it's a sacred thing to do and we're doing it for the Lord." Julie Sanchez made sure to add, "We don't try to push people to join." And then Mary Galazin said, "On the other hand... there's Nancy Rockman. She called me and said, 'Altar Guild is meeting Monday night at 7:00. I'll pick you up!'" And Galazin has been a member ever since.†

WALK A WAY September 10 - 12, 2024


HERITAGE TRAIL-Dyersville to Dubuque

An lowan pilgrimage experience to step away from our routines into a way of being that supports listening and letting go. We depart from Mason City on Tuesday morning, September 10 and return late afternoon on

Thursday, September 12. We begin at the Field of Dreams in Dyersville, Iowa where we are invited to trust and lean into that still small voice that leads us on a journey of discovery of who we are and who God intends for us to be. We then walk the approximately 30 mile Heritage Trail from Dyersville to Dubuque spread out over the next three days. Overnight accommodations include the New Melleray Abbey in Peosta, IA and Shalom Spirituality Center in Dubuque, IA. The Reverend Stephen Benitz of St. John's Episcopal Church and Becky Elsbernd, Parish Nurse of Trinity Lutheran Church, will guide us on our pilgrimage. A support vehicle travels with us to assist as needed and to provide snacks and water along the way. More than 50 million people are living with dementia globally. In the United States, one in three seniors suffers with Alzheimer's disease or dementia at the time of their death. And yet despite the millions of individuals and families affected, dementia is often a taboo subject with limited public awareness or discourse. "Portraits of Dementia" destigmatizes those living with dementia through moving portraits and stories of lives well-lived.
