Growing up in a small town, I was raised to believe that no matter where I went, someone would be watching. Maybe it was the lack of smart phones in those days. Or maybe people simply spent more time looking out the window in the 80s. I don't know. But I learned early on that people often *were* watching. Caring adults. Nosy neighbors. Herb, across the street, who just wanted my mother to know he had seen her son and some other boys crawl out of the storm sewer earlier that day.

Being “always watched” had its pitfalls, especially as a kid who liked to explore and be independent from adults. But it was also my salvation, more than once. Like when I fell through some ice in the creek bed – and my friend’s mom saw it and came running. Or when my high school biology teacher, during a particular busy season in school, noticed me nodding off in class and pulled me aside to encourage me to take better care of myself. People were watching. And what a gift that was – those who watched and cared.

The writer of Psalm 139 prays: *Where can I go from your spirit? Or where can I flee from your presence?...Even before a word is on my tongue, you know it completely...You know when I sit down and when I rise.*

I find this passage both comforting and unnerving. It’s unnerving to think that when it comes to God’s presence and awareness, there is no hiding. God knows all our imperfections, failures and secrets. Completely. There is no such thing as privacy when it comes to God.

Yet this is also our salvation. That while we are fully seen and known by God, we are also fully loved, fully held and fully safe in God’s hands. We cannot escape God’s presence. No matter the situation or location. God is with us...in worship and in the fields. In our living rooms and our hospital rooms. In our gratefulness and our bitterness and anger. We can neglect God’s presence – forget it or even deny it – but God’s presence remains. With us. Around us. Always.

Why do we gather then? If God is everywhere, why do we worship and pray, share sacraments and sing songs together? Why do we *church*? We *church* to remember – to experience this simple truth and to let the Spirit guide us into sharing it with others. May this “God with us” meet you again this summer, wherever you are and wherever you go!




LEARN MORE ABOUT DANI VOGEL

It's safe to say Trinity Lutheran Church loves "Dans," so our new Youth Director, Dani Vogel should fit in just fine. Vogel grew up in Spring Valley, MN on an apple orchard. She remembers going to church from the time she was very young, and befriended all ages of people...many of whom she invited to her 4th birthday party. "I invited my favorite church people to my birthday party and my future stepdad was one of them!" she said. "I picked out my own stepdad in church!" she laughed.

Vogel comes to Trinity not only with a youth ministry background, but also one in Education. A Wartburg College alum, Vogel had a double major (Secondary Education and English) and a double minor (Speech/Theatre and Creative Writing). After graduating, she moved to Colorado and taught in Denver and Grand Junction. Vogel moved back to the Midwest to be a youth and family ministry person, and since then has lived all over (CO, NC, SC, CA, MN and IA). She decided that wherever she is, she "likes living near a body of water!"

Why the switch from teaching to youth ministry? Vogel explained: "In public education, I couldn't make sure I could help kids enough, for example, help them have safe places to be," she said. "That's why I went into youth and family ministry!" She had volunteered at the YMCA in college and loved kids, so it was a natural fit. "I wanted something where I could still teach ONE book of literature...and I never have to flunk anybody!" she laughed.

Her teaching background comes in handy with being a youth director. "I know the school environment and where to pop up and support kids," Vogel said. She absolutely LOVES being in youth and family ministry. "I love it! 10 out of 10!" she exclaimed. "I still use curriculum development and milestones (such as standards and benchmarks). My Education background has uniquely prepared me for it!"

What's in store for Trinity as far as having a new Youth Director? "We're approaching this position differently than before," she explained. "I want to figure out what our kids need and what our community of faith needs and then go from there!"

She continued, "Because no two congregations look alike and no two groups of students need the same things, I want to adapt to what kids need and not what I think they need."

Vogel also has a great perspective on what it's like to be a woman in the church...especially in youth ministry. A lot of her good friends also work in churches and she said, "It's fun to have friends who understand!" She belongs to an organization called Women in Youth Ministry and has met many friends there. "We help each other out and have become good friends. We brainstorm Vacation Bible School decorations together

and do things like watch a Royals game together," she said. What began as a Facebook group has now turned into a group that has been around for ten years and has even held an annual conference the last three years. It's a huge support group, according to Vogel, and it includes all sorts of denominations.

Another group in which Vogel is involved is the Youth Ministries Network, known simply as "The Network." They host an ELCA Extravaganza where she serves as the online programmer and host who helps increase engagement among online attendees. It's through "The Network" that her director helped her learn of the Trinity position, as he happened to be a friend of Pastor Dan's. And all of a sudden, Vogel found herself moving to Iowa from her position in California. "The cost of living is MUCH more manageable on a church salary here," she noted.

Pastor Daniel also shares a commonality with Vogel, as for many years they crossed paths as youth leaders and planned trips such as The Gathering in Houston in 2019. Orange and black must be two of their favorite colors as Pastor Daniel and Dani are both Wartburg grads as well.

Vogel added some last-minute tidbits that the congregation should know about her as she is officially onboard the Trinity staff. "I don't believe Maid-Rites should be as world-renowned as they are in Iowa," she said. Along with that, "It's nice to be back in a place where I don't get questioned about wearing MN Vikings attire!" Vogel is very much looking forward to "the stuff that kids are involved in...like sports, music, theatre, and video gaming."

LENDING A HELPING HAND IN SPENCER, IA

We worked side by side helping our neighbors in Spencer, Iowa recover after the devastating flood of June 22, 2024. Volunteers from Mason City included Jack Dettmer, Devon Dettmer, Carly Shafer, Easton Beyer, Taylor May, Bill Shafer, Tom Dettmer, Becky Dettmer, Carol Dettmer, LaVonne Welch, Julie Martin, David Sjostrand, Julie Farland, Becky Elsbernd, and Jacob Shafer. We were joined by seven volunteers from Bethany Lutheran Church in Spencer.

Volunteers carried out various items from wet basements including a pinball machine, refrigerator, water heater, bookshelf, and carpet...lots of soaked carpet. One group of volunteers helped the homeowners remove carpet and pad from their dark basement as they still waited for their electricity to return. The piles of ruined possessions lined the streets. Other volunteers washed walls, picked up debris in the median, and chopped donated fruit for the free lunches served to the community. We brought prayer squares that were quilted by Lynne Meyers and passed them out to the people we helped. Everywhere we looked we saw people lending a helping hand where it was needed, whether it be neighbors helping neighbors or volunteers helping through agencies such as the Red Cross or Samaritan's Purse. When the group was asked to sum up their experience in one word, these were some of the words shared....humbling, generosity, strength, community, relief, inspiring, faith, family, compassion, friendships, reflection and love.

Reflections shared on the drive back to Mason City:

- “We all have struggles and it helped me put my problems in perspective and reminded me we are not alone.”
- “What’s in our basement? It inspires me to declutter the stuff in our lives and to remember it is just stuff.”
- “I went because of the friends I have in Spencer. It felt good to help after the Mason City flood in 2008 and it felt good to help again.”
- “It broke my heart when I saw the emotional toil it was taking on them. I hope we provided some relief.”
- “Just to know that there are people in the world to count on to me that’s Christianity. As Christians we are called to help one another even if it’s just a little bit.”

We lifted the community up in prayer and did the little we could in one day’s work. We hope that we gave as much as we received. We headed back to Mason City with sore muscles, hearts full of compassion, and strengthened faith in the goodness of humankind. †


