Sometimes faith is simple. But somein] between times it's messy and nuanced – more complex than black or white, one thing

or the other. This Lent, we are letting the Gospel of Luke guide us to the "in-between" nature of following Jesus. This weekend's story focuses on Zacchaeus. The crowds grumble at Jesus' selfinvitation to stay at his house, and their righteous indignation isn't without cause. As a tax collector, Zacchaeus has extorted money and acted in collusion with the empire, using his position to oppress his own people. It is important to call out oppression, and yet, Jesus offers mercy. That mercy then begets more mercy as Zacchaeus, unprompted, offers to return what he took, and then some.




