When you read a Gospel from beginning to end, as we did this Lent at Trinity, you notice things. One thing I noticed in my reading was the way Luke moves the spotlight around from one character to the next.

For much of Luke's story, the disciples are the key supporting actors. After Jesus – of course – it is Peter, James and John who get the most attention. Until Jesus is arrested. Then Peter and the boys disappear from the narrative and the spotlight moves to some unexpected, but crucial, people.

Like Simon of Cyrene. We never learn much about Simon. Luke says he was “coming from the country” when Jesus, dragging his cross toward Golgotha, passes by (Luke 23:26). Seized by some soldiers, Simon is made to carry Christ's cross. Was it his choice to be there? Bad luck? Hard to tell, but the story isn't the same without Simon and his quiet service to the Lord.

On Easter, according to Luke, the women are the first witnesses to the resurrection. Rarely, if ever before in the story are Mary Magdalene, Joanna, or Mary the mother of James mentioned. Yet it is their love and commitment to Jesus that puts them at the tomb that morning. Luke wants us to see them. He wants us to understand the importance of quiet servants in God's reign.

This month a number of quiet servants are getting much-deserved recognition for their crucial role in our congregation. Lou Ann Rossler, our Administrative Assistant to Congregational Life since 2013, is retiring. Her ministry of care, support, and organizational wizardry has blessed us all. We will celebrate her in worship and fellowship the weekend of May 17-18.

The North Iowa Band Festival Committee has selected Trinity for its 2025 Klempnauer Award. This honor is given to those working “behind the scenes” to ensure the success of Band Festival. For decades, Trinity's Altar Guild has provided food and hospitality for the band kings and queens from area high schools. Dave Smith, our custodian, provides set-up and support for the parade judges, trombone fanfare group and parade volunteers. These servants will be honored with a float in this year's parade – watch for them on May 24!

While the spotlight often shines on those up front, God rejoices over quiet servants. Thanks be to God for all whose love and dedication happens without fanfare or attention.

If anyone knows the fine art of working as a church Administrative Assistant to Congregational Life, it's Lou Ann Rossler. Working in this capacity for 32 years has allowed Rossler to use her talents to the fullest in three churches: Paynesville Lutheran Church in Paynesville, MN; Rolling Acres Christian Reformed Church in Mason City, and Trinity Lutheran Church. Rossler will be retiring at the end of May, and she will take so many memories with her.

Some of her highlights of working at Trinity over the years include all the people she has met and all the interactions with different members. "You get to really know them," Rossler said. "They're a part of your life and you're a part of theirs." In order to be effective in her position, she advised, "You really have to like people and be able to deal with distractions! You can't be an

introvert! You have to talk to everyone from the [people on the] phone calls to people who walk in off the street."

On the other hand, a major drawback of this

position over the years also involves people. "You get close to people...and then they pass away," she said. "It's like a death in the family."

For a person who graduated with a degree in social work, Rossler has certainly been utilizing her listening and problem-solving skills in her chosen profession. "Sweetie, I think the reason I'm in this position is it's truly a ministry! You have to WANT to help people and be with people."

Of course, Trinity's congregation members (and staff) will miss that lovely term of endearment that only Lou Ann Rossler can call us. "Sweetie" has been in her vocabulary for as long as she can remember. When she officially retires, her husband, Cliff, should prepare to be the sole recipient of this "sweet" term of affection. Retirement plans of course involve Cliff, as she said they have multiple home projects, the first being cleaning out their garage. In true Lou Ann fashion, she giggled and said she's going to have to get a completely differ-

ent wardrobe, because of course she can't wear her dress clothes to clean!

She also wants to travel and accompany Cliff when he goes fishing. "I want to do some volunteer work, participating in church activities that I could never do

when I was working," she said. "I also have a plethora of books I want to read...and take naps and eat ice cream!"

For a person who started at Trinity part-time in 2012 and moved to full-time the following year, Rossler has made a huge difference in so many people's lives...from the Trinity staff who adores her as much as she adores them to the parents and children who have utilized the nursery, which she was in charge of since 2013.

Of course, her family will get to see more of her now, and additional precious memories will be made. Cliff is also retired and volunteers where he is needed; their daughter, Leslie works as a nanny in Rochester, and their son, Matthew is a pastor at two churches in Decorah.

Award-Winning Behind-the-Scenes Work at Band Fest

Mention 'Band Fest' to anyone in north Iowa and images come to mind...images of marching bands, throngs of people, a festival that lasts for days and of course, the big parade. All of the activities go on year after year almost seamlessly, yet SO much background work by hundreds of people has made each year seem "the best one yet."

This year, Trinity Lutheran Church is lucky to be the recipient of a huge award that recognizes the effort given behind the scenes of Band Fest. This award is usually given to an individual, but Trinity's work over the past two decades has made such a difference that it was deemed award-winning. The award in particular is the Klempnauer Award, which was started in 1993. Mason City's Chamber of Commerce newsletter, *Business Matters*, explains that the Klempnauer Award was named for Dan Klempnauer, "a long-time volunteer and festival supporter, and is intended to honor an unsung hero who volunteers for the festival." Trinity was "chosen because of its hospitality, serving lunch and refreshments for Band Festival Royalty, which has become a cherished tradition. Trinity also serves as a staging area and judging location for the parade, and the church's grounds have become a gathering space for spectators."

The Chamber newsletter also pointed out that "in addition to its festival involvement, Trinity invites visitors to join outdoor worship on the Sunday of Band Festival weekend, creating a welcoming space for reflection and connection. The church's participation in the festival highlights its mission to serve the community and bring people together in celebration."

According to the North Iowa Band Festival Foundation, this award traditionally recognizes "an individual who has made a significant contribution to the development, history, or success of the North Iowa Band Festival." The

awardees typically have worked "behind the scenes" to ensure the success of the festival, and other than two of the past awardees, each year has honored an individual.

Colleen Frein, President and CEO of the Mason City Chamber of Commerce, explains why Trinity was chosen as the award recipient this year: "The Klempnauer Award is meant to honor an unsung hero of Band Festival, and we could think of no one more deserving than Trinity Lutheran Church. Trinity is our home base during parade day, and we are so thankful that the congregation is willing to open its doors to us each year, support our royalty candidates, and allow us to take over the parking lot, grounds, and neighboring streets for the morning to put on the parade. There is a lot of work that goes on behind the scenes that no one realizes is happening, especially with the office and custodial staff. For all of these reasons, Trinity is a perfect example of what the Klempnauer Award represents!"

As an award winner, the responsibilities include riding in the parade and accepting the award at the Awards Ceremony after the parade. It may take quite a large convertible to fit all of Trinity's Band Fest helpers, as the Altar Guild and several other members play huge roles in seeing that everything goes smoothly.

Julie Sanchez has been a member of the Altar Guild for 20 years and says the group "loves serving the Kings/Queens' luncheon...and just being a part of the Band Festival!" She mentioned that the Altar Guild volunteers spend the whole day at Trinity, along with the Chamber workers and volunteers. "There are people coming and going all day long!" Sanchez said.

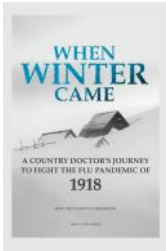
The Altar Guild's responsibilities begin the day before the parade, getting as much ready for the Saturday luncheon as possible, and then they are back at it around 8 AM Saturday morning, finishing luncheon preparations and setting the buffet table up. Sanchez said, "Then we usually go outside and watch the parade, until it's time to serve lunch. After lunch, we clean up the kitchen and our day is done."

Sanchez's favorite memories of Band Fest revolve around the luncheons. She said, "When I first joined [Altar Guild], it was very elaborate. We served in the
