Summer Series: Conversations with God

Join us as we explore how God engages people through powerful moments of dialogue, decision, and divine direction. Each week, we will examine a different biblical character or moment where a conversation with God—spoken, implied, or lived out—shaped lives, communities, and futures.

This weekend we explore divine wisdom. The book of Proverbs personifies wisdom who cries out to all that will listen in creation. The Apostle Paul, in 1 Corinthians, looks to Christ's cross to guide us to divine wisdom. What is wise? What is foolish? Through conversation with Scripture and dialogue among God's people, we today seek God's wisdom to shape our lives and communities.

First Reading: Proverbs 8:1-4, 22-31

- 1 Does not wisdom call, and does not understanding raise her voice?
- 2 On the heights, beside the way, at the crossroads she takes her stand;
- 3 beside the gates in front of the town, at the entrance of the portals she cries out:
- 4 "To you, O people, I call, and my cry is to all that live.
- 22 The Lord created me at the beginning of his work, the first of his acts of long ago.
- 23 Ages ago I was set up, at the first, before the beginning of the earth.
- 24 When there were no depths I was brought forth, when there were no springs abounding with water.
- 25 Before the mountains had been shaped, before the hills, I was brought forth—
- 26 when he had not yet made earth and fields, or the world's first bits of soil.
- 27 When he established the heavens, I was there, when he drew a circle on the face of the deep,
- 28 when he made firm the skies above, when he established the fountains of the deep,
- 29 when he assigned to the sea its limit, so that the waters might not transgress his command, when he marked out the foundations of the earth,
- 30 then I was beside him, like a master worker; and I was daily his delight, rejoicing before him always,
- 31 rejoicing in his inhabited world and delighting in the human race."

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 1:18 - 31

18 For the message about the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God. 19 For it is written,

"I will destroy the wisdom of the wise,

and the discernment of the discerning I will thwart."

20 Where is the one who is wise? Where is the scholar? Where is the debater of this age? Has not God made foolish the wisdom of the world? 21 For since, in the wisdom of God, the world did not know God through wisdom, God decided, through the foolishness of the proclamation, to save those who believe. 22 For Jews ask for signs and Greeks desire wisdom, 23 but we proclaim Christ crucified, a stumbling block to Jews and foolishness to gentiles, 24 but to those who are the called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God. 25 For God's foolishness is wiser than human wisdom, and God's weakness is stronger than human strength.

26 Consider your own call, brothers and sisters: not many of you were wise by human standards, not many were powerful, not many were of noble birth. 27 But God chose what is foolish in the world to shame the wise; God chose what is weak in the world to shame the strong; 28 God chose what is low and despised in the world, things that are not, to abolish things that are, 29 so that no one might boast in the presence of God. 30 In contrast, God is why you are in Christ Jesus, who became for us wisdom from God, and right-eousness and sanctification and redemption, 31 in order that, as it is written, "Let the one who boasts, boast in the Lord."




