Summer Series: Conversations with God

Join us as we explore how God engages people through powerful moments of dialogue, decision, and divine direction. Each week, we will examine a different biblical character or moment where a conversation with God—spoken, implied, or lived out—shaped lives, communities, and futures.

For the second week, we hear words from the prophet Amos, who brings a difficult word of judgement to the kingdom of Israel. During an age of prosperity, these ancient people refuse to see the image of God in the poor and vulnerable. They exploit the vulnerable for their own gain and refuse to change their ways. Through Amos, God brings word of their impending conquest.

How do we wrestle with God's anger in this passage? Might there be things in the world that we would want God to be angry about?

³The songs of the temple shall become wailings in that day,"

says the Lord God;

"the dead bodies shall be many, cast out in every place. Be silent!"

⁴Hear this, you that trample on the needy, and bring to ruin the poor of the land,

⁵ saying, "When will the new moon be over so that we may sell grain;

and the sabbath, so that we may offer wheat for sale?

We will make the ephah small and the shekel great, and practice deceit with false balances, ⁶ buying the poor for silver and the needy for a pair of sandals,

and selling the sweepings of the wheat."




