Sometime after 1871, when the Scandinavian Lutheran Church of Mason City was formed, the women saw a need they felt compelled to fill. So they did what knew best-they baked their ethnic Scandinavian treats, brought in their hand-crafted items and served meals. In the late 1940's a talk of having a bazaar was brought up. I do not know how much money was raised, but having a Norwegian grandmother who would have been about their age, I can imagine they bought a necessary item for the church, probably gave some of the funds to the youth for education, and almost certainly gave some to the needy in the community. Perhaps if there was a dollar or two left they may have even given it to the

pastor to help supplement their needs. When it was all done, they probably sat and finishing up the last of the coffee, looked at each other and said, "This was good! We will do it again next year."

If these ladies could experience the Trinity Scandinavian Bazaar today, I think they would be pleased to see we are still serving handmade lefse and pastries, using their time honored recipes. They would be a little surprised at how many in the congregation take an active part..especially how many men are helping. Not only with the heavy set-up and tear-down, but with working in the kitchen, serving food, coffee, and helping clean up along with their wives and friends.

They would be overjoyed to see how the community embraces and looks forward to the Bazaar every year. To see the church full of people experiencing the hospitality of Trinity. From the chatter in the Fellowship Hall as they enjoy the pastries, delicious and beautiful sandwiches and of course bottomless cups of coffee in the Coffee Shop. To see the people browsing through the unique items in the Scandinavian Boutique, looking at the wonderfully made items in the Craft Creations, finding the right book, puzzle or game in the Book Nook, getting a special homemade treat in the Bake Shop then stopping to buy lefse to take home.

The ladies would be amazed to see we sell 500 meals all made here on site. This includes selling take-out meals on Wednesday evening for those who are working or can't attend the Bazaar. The Thursday dinner in the beautifully decorated Fellowship Hall, tables set and all the helpers seeing to their needs like a four-star restaurant. And of course, they would expect nothing less than to see tables laden with an assortment of homemade pies.

But most of all I think their hearts would be full to see how their humble event has continued and grown over the years. To know that the funds raised have helped so many in need in the community for so many years. In 2024 we were able to donate \$23,150.00 to 25 different charities and organizations. Yes, a little was given to the kitchen to help keep it going, and the youth also received some funds, but over 80% went out into the community to help support the never-ending needs of those less fortunate than us. Sad to say there wasn't a dollar or two left for the pastors, but there may be extra meatballs or a special piece of pie held for them.

At the end of the day, when we gather in our circle to give thanks to God for His generosity and blessing on our Bazaar, we probably will look at each other, and with a humble smile say, "This was good! We will do it again next year."

school, eat lunch together daily, or even ride on the same buses. Often their common place to be together as a group is here, clustered in our youth room, sanctuary, or assorted classes including Confirmation and Sunday School. So knowing that, how to we help foster relationships and support with our students? We go where they go, we shop where they work, and we wave furiously at them from the sidelines, chairs, and stands we sit in at their various events.

Trinity youth are involved in activities that range from archery to volleyball, jazz bands to Follies and musicals, Stebens and swimming, 4-H and FFA. Over 15 of our Trinity youth ran at a recent cross country meet at MCHS. This included at least 3 different local high schools alone. If you haven't gotten a chance recently to watch one of our students shine in one of their many activities, we encourage you to chat with your old prayer mentor partner, reach out to the student you mentored in confirmation, or just ask the student who sits in a pew near you what their next event and activity is.

Research put out by The Search Institute shows that students who have at least 5 caring adults in their lives are more likely to reach their life goals, be more present and active in their community, have stronger resiliency and mental health, and have more academic success. We encourage you to take some time to connect with the youth at Trinity and be one of their five adults in their lives. †


Fall Bike Ride on the Greenbelt
