Advent 2025: A Promised Savior

In the season of Advent, we count down the days until Christmas. This Advent, we center our worship on God's promise: the promise of a Savior. Trusting in God's enduring faithfulness, we prepare our hearts to celebrate Jesus' birth on Christmas while our longing hearts wait in hope for God's promised Savior's reign of peace.

Week 3 Theme: How do you feel when you hold onto a belief that the deepest desire of your heart will come true even before you see any evidence? How do you feel when you get a glimmer that what you hardly dared hope for is becoming a reality? This week we reflect on how

Lighting of Advent Wreath & Children's Sermon (Sunday)

- L This Advent, we countdown the days until Christmas by lighting candles on the Advent wreath. Each bright light shines hope into our world and our hearts. God's love is near.
- C Jesus, you are our light and our salvation.
- L We light the first Advent candle, remembering God keeps promises, even promises made long ago.
- C Jesus, you fulfil the promise of God's saving grace.
- L Today, we light the second candle, longing for peace in our world and celebrating where it is found.
- C Jesus, you are the Prince of Peace.
- P Today we light the third candle, opening our eyes to God's work in our world today.
- C Jesus, you are our refuge and strength.
- P Jesus, we carry your light with us wherever we go.
- C Shine in our hearts, Lord Jesus.

First Reading: Isaiah 11:1-10

- ¹ A shoot shall come out from the stump of Jesse, and a branch shall grow out of his roots.
 - ² The spirit of the Lord shall rest on him, the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord.
 - ³ His delight shall be in the fear of the Lord.
 - He shall not judge by what his eyes see or decide by what his ears hear,
 - ⁴ but with righteousness he shall judge for the poor and decide with equity for the oppressed of the earth;
 - he shall strike the earth with the rod of his mouth, and with the breath of his lips he shall kill the wicked.

GOSPEL: Luke 1:26-45

P The Holy Gospel according to Luke, the first chapter.

C Glory to You, O Lord.

²⁶ In the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent by God to a town in Galilee called Nazareth, ²⁷ to a virgin engaged to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David. The virgin's name was Mary. ²⁸ And he came to her and said, "Greetings, favored one! The Lord is with you." ²⁹ But she was much perplexed by his words and pondered what sort of greeting this might be. ³⁰ The angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. ³¹ And now, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you will name him Jesus. ³² He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High, and the Lord God will give to him the throne of his ancestor David. ³³ He will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and of his kingdom there will be no end." ³⁴ Mary said to the angel, "How can this be, since I am a virgin?" ³⁵ The angel said to her, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; therefore the child to be born will be holy; he will be called Son of God. ³⁶ And now, your relative Elizabeth in her old age has also conceived a son, and this is the sixth month for her who was said to be barren. ³⁷ For nothing will be impossible with God." ³⁸ Then Mary said, "Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word." Then the angel departed from her.

³⁹ In those days Mary set out and went with haste to a Judean town in the hill country, ⁴⁰ where she entered the house of Zechariah and greeted Elizabeth. ⁴¹ When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the child leaped in her womb. And Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit ⁴² and exclaimed with a loud cry, "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb. ⁴³ And why has this happened to me, that the mother of my Lord comes to me? ⁴⁴ For as soon as I heard the sound of your greeting, the child in my womb leaped for joy. ⁴⁵ And blessed is she who believed that there would be a fulfillment of what was spoken to her by the Lord."
