Lent was originally a season for new converts to Christianity to learn and prepare for their baptism on Easter. During that time, they would study what was central to Jesus' life and ministry: God's mercy, radical welcome, love for neighbor, care for the vulnerable, nourishment for the hungry, and nonviolence in the face of injustice. At the heart of Jesus' teachings, we find liberation, love, mercy, and grace—good news for us and for all people. The good news is... all are invited...

We begin Ash Wednesday with an open invitation. Today's parable invites us into a communal feast. The host of the party sends a servant to search the entire city to bring people in: Though the net is cast wide, too many guests deny the invitation, instead focusing on their individual concerns. Yet, the host's invitation is persistent. They search high and low for the dispossessed and the vulnerable, perhaps those who are hungry to accept the invitation. As guests are gathered in, the miracle is that there is still room. There is more love and abundance available, if only we are present to receive it.





The Imposition of Ashes and Communion

Lent is a time for us to return to our Creator who formed us from the dust of the earth. Our lives are finite, so we want to spend every precious moment in tune with God, living whole, abundant lives—the kind of lives we were created to lead. And so in recognition of our origins in the earth, in acknowledgment of our finite days, we come to receive ashes and remember: dust we are, and to dust we shall return.

The imposition of ashes and distribution of Communion will take place together.

The ministers apply ashes to the forehead of each person at the first station with the words:

“Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return.”

If you do not desire ashes you may move directly to the communion station.

Communion will be served by intinction today. Receive the wafer from the server and then dip it into the wine or the grape juice before eating it. Gluten free wafers are available. Check with your server.

If for any reason you are not comfortable participating in communion today, we invite you to come forward with your arms crossed over your chest to receive a blessing.
